

- What do each of these faces have in common?








- Sharing and informing
- Generally you are selling a product
 - Be knowledgeable
 - Be confident
 - Be factual
 - Be upbeat

- Training and teaching
- Be the expert
- Demonstrate knowledge
- Be comfortable in your presentation
- Share stories so the audience connects

- Are you presenting...
 - In-person
 - On-line real time
 - In a controlled webinar
 - On a pod-cast or YouTube video

Cutout People Can


- Use characters to draw attention to specific areas on your slide.
- People will look where a character is looking.
- · A character's gestures will also direct a viewer.
- Lead your audience with cutout characters.



- When presenting in person you...
- Commit to the people in front of you
- Dialogue and ask questions
- Get a feel for the class and focus on what's needed
- Learning is about relationships
- Workbooks and PowerPoints are references

- On-line real time
 - Know your webinar product
 - Lots to choose from
 - Be sure you practice
 - Know what the buttons do in advance of your real time presentation
 - Have a monitor in place

- Webinar training is the same as in-person
 - Make your audience comfortable
 - Introduce yourself
 - SMILE
 - Use a head set
 - Be away from distractions
 - If you can't be away from distractions explain where you are...



In a controlled webinar you are generally a part of a panel of presenters

Know your material

Present in a factual and welcoming manner

Don't talk over another presenter

Wait your turn

- Podcasts and YouTube videos
 - These are recorded events
 - The presenter controls the event
 - Podcasts are generally voice and PowerPoint events
 - YouTube videos are best when recorded live and uploaded to a specific channel

You need to know your audience and the reasons for their attendance...


Why are we here today?

Engage your audience


- Polls
