



# Federal Resources



## Statute

What's in the law. Higher Education Act of 1965 as *amended*. Congress provides authority to agencies.



## Regulations

Title 34, Subtitle B, Chapter VI of the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR). Implements the law.



## Sub-Regulatory

Operational guidance; NOT legally binding, but agency may explain HOW regs are interpreted.

# Resources for undocumented students

- **Center for Immigrant and Refugee Advancement (CIRA)**: A Nebraska non-profit that provides legal and social services, education rights info, and legal guidance related to student status.
- **Nebraska Appleseed**: A non-profit advocacy and legal organization that supports low-income and undocumented students in navigating college policies and barriers. It maintains one of the most trusted Nebraska-specific scholarship lists for undocumented and DACA students.

# Audit Resources

## **Single Audit Compliance Supplement** *(for public and nonprofit schools)*

- Issued annually by OMB, this document defines which compliance requirements must be tested for each federal program and where ED has added or emphasized Special Tests and Provisions.
- FA leaders should review the Student Financial Aid Cluster before the audit to better prepare for what auditors will request and review.

## **Title IV Audit Guides** *(for proprietary and foreign schools and third-party servicers)*

- Issued annually by OIG, it provides detailed audit procedures and testing methodology for the other type of IHEs and servicers.

## **Federal Audit Clearinghouse Search**

- The central repository for submitting, processing, and reviewing Single Audit reports of federal grant recipients.
- Look up other schools' audits and Corrective Action Plans to help determine a course of action for your own findings.

## **Top 10 Audit & Program Review Findings**

- Used to be published annually by FSA in school data info, but the last one added was for FY23 and the last Companion Report was in FY22.
- Helpful to follow trends and see where greatest compliance risks are.



# Pick Your Pathway

**In an R2T4 calc, what is the Date of Determination of withdrawal for an unofficial withdrawal?**

- 1. Regulatory Pathway:** Code of Federal Regulations [[34 CFR 668.22\(l\)\(3\)](#)] *Treatment of title IV funds when a student withdraws, Definitions.*
- 2. Federal Student Aid Handbook Pathway:** Volume 5, *Withdrawals and the Return of Title IV Funds*, Chapter 1, *General Requirements for Withdrawals and the Return of Title IV Funds*, section on Principles With Unique Applications in the Return of Title IV Aid.
- 3. Ask Regs Pathway:** [See KA-33439](#) – How Do You Determine the Date Of the Institution's Determination That the Student Withdrew?
- 4. Phone a Friend.** Having connections and asking someone for help is a great start, but be sure to cite the regs if defending something in an audit or updating your P&P! 😊

# Pick Your Pathway




I have two new staff with completely different roles starting the same day. How can I train them?


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
